LLAMAS
LLAMAS ARE A MEMBER OF THE CAMELID FAMILY AND ARE NATIVE TO SOUTH AMERICA. THEIR USES INCLUDE SHOWING, PACKING, DRIVING, WOOL, PETS, AND BREEDING. THE LLAMAS GESTATION PERIOD IS 11-12 MONTHS AND THEY RARELY HAVE TWINS. AN ADULT LLAMA CAN CARRY 60-80 POUNDS 8-10 MILES PER DAY. ALTHOUGH THEY DO SPIT AT EACH OTHER, THEY SELDOM SPIT AT PEOPLE. LLAMAS HUM TO THEIR BABIES AND THEY ALSO HAVE A HIGH PITCHED SCREAM WHICH IS AN ALARM CALL. THEY ARE VERY GENTLE, CLEAN ANIMALS AND A JOY TO RAISE.

146687 - LLAMA INFO

DONKEY ... ALSO KNOWN AS BURRO OR ASS, IS THE LONGEST EARED MEMBER OF THE EQUINE FAMILY. THE FEMALE IS CALLED A JENNET OR JENNY AND THE MALE IS KNOWN AS A JACK. DONKEYS ARE GROUPED BY SIZE: MINIATURES ARE 36" AND UNDER, MAMMOTHS ARE 54" AND OVER AND EVERYTHING IN BETWEEN ARE STANDARDS. COLORS RANGE FROM GREY-DUN, BLACK, OR WHITE TO SPOTTED. DONKEYS ARE AFFECTIONATE, CURIOUS AND GENTLE, BUT ALSO CAUTIOUS WHICH IS OFTEN MISTAKEN FOR STUBBORNNESS. DONKEYS ARE USED FOR RIDING, DRIVING, PACKING OR GUARDING SHEEP AND MAKE WONDERFUL FAMILY PETS.

146693 - DONKEY INFO

MULES ... A WONDER OF NATURE A MULE IS THE RESULT OF BREEDING A MALE DONKEY (ALSO CALLED A BURRO OR JACKASS) TO A FEMALE HORSE (MARE). DUE TO A CHROMOSOME IMBALANCE OF THIS HYBRID BREEDING, A MULE IS ALMOST ALWAYS STERILE. A MALE MULE IS CALLED A JOHN AND IS USUALLY GELDED TO MAKE HIM MORE MANAGEABLE. A FEMALE MULE IS CALLED A MOLLY. WHEN A REVERSE BREEDING A MALE HORSE (STALLION) TO A FEMALE DONKEY (JENNET OR JENNY) OCCURS, THE RESULTING FOAL IS CALLED A HINNEY WHICH IS ALSO USUALLY STERILE.

ELK (*Cervus elaphus*) ... ARE VERY LARGE MEMBERS OF THE CERVIDAE FAMILY STANDING 5-6 FT. HIGH AT THE SHOULDER, MALES WEIGH UP TO 900 LBS. THE BODY COLOR IS REDDISH-BROWN IN SUMMER AND GRAY IN WINTER WITH A DISTINCTIVE YELLOWISH RUMP PATCH AND A HEAVY BROWN MANE. MALES HAVE LARGE IMPRESSIVE ANTLERS THAT SHED EACH SPRING. AT ONE TIME ELK RANGED OVER MUCH OF THE NORTHERN U.S. FROM THE PACIFIC COAST TO THE APPALACHIANS. BY 1900 THEY WERE GONE FROM MUCH OF THIS AREA AND ARE FOUND TODAY IN THE CANADIAN ROCKIES AND IN ALL WESTERN STATES EXCEPT ALASKA.

ALPACA
THE RARE ALPACA IS A CHARMING AND VALUABLE MEMBER OF THE CAMELID FAMILY. ALPACAS ARE PRIZED FOR THEIR LUXURIOUS AND COSTLY FIBER WHICH IS HARVESTED BY SHEARING ONCE A YEAR. AN ALPACA SWEATER OR BLANKET IS A CHERISHED POSSESSION, FREQUENTLY HANDED DOWN FROM ONE GENERATION TO THE NEXT. THE ALPACA GESTATION PERIOD IS 11 MONTHS. THE BABY IS CALLED A CRIA. ALPACAS ARE A HERD ANIMAL AND ARE NATIVE TO THE ANDES MOUNTAINS OF SOUTH AMERICA. ALPACAS ARE VERY GENTLE, CLEAN ANIMALS AND MAKE WONDERFUL PETS.

146718 - ALPACA INFO

OSTRICH EMU, RHEA, CASSOWARY AND KIWI MAKE UP THE RATITE FAMILY OF FLIGHTLESS BIRDS. "RATITES" (FROM THE LATIN WORD FOR RAFT, A BOAT WITHOUT A KEEL), HAVE A FLAT BREASTBONE WITHOUT THE KEEL-LIKE STRUCTURE TO WHICH FLIGHT MUSCLES ARE ATTACHED IN FLYING BIRDS. THEY ARE NATIVE TO THE SOUTHERN HEMISPHERE, THE MALE BUILDS THE NEST, INCUBATES THE EGGS, AND CARES FOR THE YOUNG. THEIR RANGE IN SIZE FROM THE OSTRICH, THE WORLDS LARGEST BIRD, 8' TALL AND 300 LBS TO THE 12" KIWI THAT WEIGHS 3-9 LBS.

146704 - RATITE INFO

AMERICAN BISON
OFTEN INCORRECTLY REFERRED TO AS BUFFALO, ARE MEMBERS OF THE BOVIDAE FAMILY WHICH ALSO INCLUDES CATTLE AND YAK. DURING THE EARLY PART OF THE 1800'S, BISON STILL LIVED IN HERDS OF HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS IN NORTH AMERICA FROM THE ATLANTIC TO THE PACIFIC COAST. HUNTED TO NEAR EXTINCTION, THERE ARE VERY FEW LEFT IN THE WILD. MOST BISON TODAY ARE FOUND ON PRIVATE RANCHES OR GAME REFUGES. NUMBERS HAVE NOW INCREASED TO A LEVEL WHERE BISON ARE BEING MARKETED COMMERCIALY. BISON MEAT IS A LOW FAT LOW CHOLESTEROL ALTERNATIVE MEAT SOURCE. MATURE BULLS STAND 6' HIGH AT THE SHOULDERS AND CAN WEIGH UP TO 2,000 LBS. MATURE COWS STAND 5' AND WEIGH 1,000 LBS. GESTATION IS 270 - 300 DAY'S WITH A SINGLE CALF BEING BORN.

146722 - BISON INFO

Pot Bellied PIGS ARE NATIVE TO SOUTHEAST ASIA. THEY ARE CLEAN, ODORLESS PIGS THAT ARE EASILY HOUSE TRAINED AND MAKE EXCELLENT PETS. USUALLY BLACK, THEY HAVE A SWAY BACK AND A STRAIGHT TAIL. THEY NEED TO BE KEPT WARM IN WINTER AND COOL IN THE SUMMER AND MUST BE PROTECTED FROM SUNBURN. YOUNG SOWS CAN BE BRED AT ABOUT 8 MONTHS OF AGE. GESTATION IS 114 DAY'S AND BABIES ARE WEANED AT 4-6 WEEKS OF AGE. AN ADULT PIG WILL WEIGH FROM 40-100 LBS AND EATS 1 TO 1-1/2 CUPS OF PIG CHOW PER DAY.
